INTRODUCTION

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Uplawmoor Community Council** area for the period **12th April to 14th May 2018**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

INFORMATION

1. Homes being broken into

There have been no reports of homes being broken in to in your Community Council area during the period under review.

Two business premises have been broken into between the 15th and the 17th April in Lochlibo Road and Neilston Road, respectively. Enquiries are ongoing in relation to these two crimes.

2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder

There have been no reports made to the police relating to public nuisance or disturbance.

About 1610 hours on the 7th May, a 26 year old man was arrested in Lochlibo Road, Uplawmoor, for conducting himself in a threatening and abusive manner, following an earlier incident out with Uplawmoor.

3. Violent crime

There have been no crime reports raised during the period under review for violent crime in your area.

4. Drug dealing and misuse

There have been no crime reports raised for drugs offences in your area during the period under review.

At this time of year, it is not uncommon for us to observe seasonal increases in reports of thefts from sheds/garages and other outbuildings. Please take the time to ensure that such buildings are well secured. Consider fitting a shed alarm, or more advanced security measures if higher value items are stored within.
