Our focus..... Your priorities

INTRODUCTION

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Uplawmoor Community Council** area for the 2 month period **14th November 2018 to 17th January 2019**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

INFORMATION

1. Homes being broken into

There has been one reported housebreaking in your Community Council area during the period under review. This occurred at a dwelling house in Mure Park, Uplawmoor sometime between the 15th and 16th December, and remains under investigation.

Also of note is that on the morning of the 3rd January, two works vans were broken into in Mure Park and Neilston Road, Uplawmoor.

2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder

There have been no reports made to the police relating to any form of public nuisance or disturbance.

3. Violent crime

There have been no crime reports raised during the period under review for violent crime in your area.

4. Drug dealing and misuse

There have been no crime reports raised for drugs offences in your area during the period under review.

Whilst crime levels in your area remain very low, we gain reiterate the importance of reviewing security measures and giving consideration to installing such things as CCTV and intruder alarms, which can be purchased and installed at relatively low cost.



As the nights get darker earlier Police Scotland is reminding you to review your home security.

Some advice on keeping your home secure.

- Use timer switches on lights and radios to make it look as if your home is occupied
 - Ensure all doors and windows are secure when you leave and when you go to bed
 - If possible use security lighting at the front and back of your property
 - Make sure all garden tools and ladders are locked away when not being used
 - Use a good quality lock on any garden sheds and outhouses
- Make a note of all makes, models and serial numbers of your property
 - Create a FREE private and secure inventory of all your personal property at www.immobilise.com
