

Council Tax Exemption – Estate of a Deceased Person

A property can be exempt from Council Tax if it has become unoccupied as a result of death of the only occupant.

What evidence do I need to provide?

Your application must be supported with the following evidence:

- Copy of the death certificate.
- Copy of the Grant of Confirmation, if applicable.

Complete this form in full, sign the declaration and return with the required evidence to the address at the top of this form.
