EAST RENFREWSHIRE RENEWABLE ENERGY FUND PANEL ADMINISTRATION ARRANGEMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek Cabinet approval to clarify administration arrangements in relation to the East Renfrewshire Renewable Energy Fund (ERREF) Panel.

RECOMMENDATIONS

2. The Cabinet is asked to;

- (a) Agree that the quorum for the ERREF Panel is two Elected Members;
- (b) Agree to delegate decision making to the ERREF Panel subject to any applications where there is a split decision being referred to the Director for a decision on whether or not the application should be supported; and
- (c) Homologate the decisions of the first meeting of the ERREF Panel held on 8 February 2017 in the absence of any previously established quorum requirements.

BACKGROUND

3. Previously the Whitelee Fund Panel comprised three officers, one Elected Member and two community representatives. Decisions required to be approved by the Director of Environment.

4. In April 2016 the Cabinet approved the establishment of the ERREF as the successor to the Whitelee wind farm fund. At that time, a number of changes were made to this Council-managed community benefit fund including a change to the decision making body. It was agreed that the ERREF Panel would comprise three Elected Members (subsequently agreed as Councillors Green, Lafferty and Waters) and the Chief Executive of Voluntary Action, East Renfrewshire.

5. In establishing the new ERREF Panel, the Cabinet report did not clarify the quorum for the Panel, or that the Panel had delegated decision making powers.

REPORT

6. Given the increased Elected Member representation on the new ERREF Panel, it is considered appropriate to devolve decision-making powers to the Panel without the need for recommendations made by the Panel to be approved by the Director of Environment. This would be subject to the quorum for the Panel being two Elected Members, and that (as was the case with the former Whitelee Panel) in the event of a split decision the Director will decide whether or not a proposal should be supported

7. It is proposed therefore that the quorum for the ERREF Panel should be two Elected Members.

8. The first meeting of the ERREF Panel took place on 8 February. Only two Elected Members were present. Grant applicants have been advised of the Panel's recommendations. A copy of the Panel's recommendations is attached (Appendix 1).

FINANCE AND EFFICIENCY

9. There are no financial implications arising from this report

CONSULTATION AND PARTNERSHIP WORKING

10. Consultation has taken place with the Democratic Services Manager on the administration arrangements for the Panel. The composition of the ERREF Panel demonstrates positive partnership working between the Council and the third sector.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSALS

11. There are no staffing, property, legal, IT, equalities or sustainability implications of this report.

CONCLUSIONS

12. The recommendations in this report seek to clarify the arrangements relating to the ERREF Panel operation and decision making process.

 - (a) Agree that the quorum for the ERREF Panel is two Elected Members;
 - (b) Agree to delegate decision making to the ERREF Panel subject to any applications where there is a split decision being referred to the Director for a decision on whether or not the application should be supported; and
 - (c) Homologate the decisions of the first meeting of the ERREF Panel held on 8 February 2017 in the absence of any previously established quorum requirements.



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Briefing Note for Councillors

February 2017

The East Renfrewshire Renewable Energy Fund (ERREF) superseded the Whitelee wind farm fund in 2016. Income is received from ScottishPower Renewables for Whitelee and Middleton wind farms and is administered by East Renfrewshire Council as a community benefit fund. Applications are invited annually from organisations within East Renfrewshire - including Council services.

Applications to the fund are considered by the ERREF Panel that comprises three councillors and the chief executive of Voluntary Action East Renfrewshire. A briefing note is issued to all councillors following the Panel.

The ERREF Panel considered the current round of applications on 8th February. 18 applications totalling £422,000 were submitted, competing for the available grant of £200,000. Below is a summary of the decisions.
