REQUESTS FOR CIVIC HOSPITALITY – VARIOUS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. To consider requests for the Council to host two civic receptions at one of which the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (QAVS) would be presented to Fairweather Multicultural Friendship Group, the second being to mark the Centenary of the Lodge Thistle and Crown, Neilston; and also to consider attending the first Diocese of Paisley Bishop's Fundraising Ball 2017 and Eastwood Rotary Club Fashion Show 2017 the organisation of which has also been to raise funds.

RECOMMENDATION

2. That the committee considers the requests referred to in this report and the accompanying Appendices.

BACKGROUND

3. On 26 June 2013 the Council agreed to establish a Civic Hospitality Committee with the following terms of reference:-

To be responsible for all civic hospitality matters on behalf of the Council including the:-

- consideration and determination of all requests for the provision of civic hospitality by the Council with an estimated cost of over £400;
- consideration and determination of any proposed new Council events to be funded from the civic hospitality budget; and
- consideration and approval of all protocols and procedures associated with civic hospitality.

REPORT

4. Four requests for civic hospitality have been received in recent months which require to be considered by the Committee in view of the cost of each proposal exceeding £400. Details of the requests and related proposals are set out in the remainder of this report.

Fairweather Multicultural Friendship Group

5. A request to hold a civic reception at which the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service (QAVS) would be presented to Fairweather Multicultural Friendship Group has been received from HM Lord-Lieutenant of Renfrewshire. This Group has been awarded a QAVS

in 2017, which the Lord-Lieutenant will present, for providing a supportive community for senior, ethnic minority people. The details of the proposal are included in Appendix 1 accompanying this report.

Centenary of Lodge Thistle & Crown No. 1167, Neilston

6. A request to hold a civic reception has been received from the Chair of Lodge Thistle & Crown No. 1167 to mark the Centenary of the Lodge in Neilston on 10 February 2018. The details of the proposal are included in Appendix 2 accompanying this report.

Diocese of Paisley Bishop's Ball 2017

7. A request for civic hospitality has been received from the Bishop of Paisley to attend the first Diocese of Paisley Bishop's Fundraising Ball being held in Glasgow on 7 October 2017, this being part of the Diocese's ongoing initiative to help it grow financially to match its growth in pastoral life and faith. This year the funds raised from the Ball are to be allocated towards the refurbishment of the Saint John the Evangelist Barrhead Parish Hall, which is already underway and due for completion in 2018. The Diocese has commented that the refurbishment will see it become a top class venue that will be used for celebrating family events such as weddings and other parish, pastoral and community social events. Further details of the proposal are included in Appendix 3 accompanying this report.

Eastwood Rotary Club Fashion Show

8. The report on *Civic Hospitality Costs and Use of Council Accommodation* (see Item 3) refers to a golf competition normally organised by Eastwood Rotary Club annually and an associated cost of £500 which is normally met from the civic hospitality budget on a recurring basis. The President of the Club has written to the Council explaining that it was not possible to hold this event in 2017, which it is intended to reinstate in 2018, but that as the Club is fitting out a room at the new Prince and Princess of Wales Hospice and working to raise money for that cause, it is running a fashion show in Newton Mearns in October. It is seeking support for this event instead in 2017 in terms of the purchase of tickets. Details of the proposal are included in Appendix 4 accompanying this report.

BUDGET

9. The 2017/18 budget for civic hospitality is £18,000 having been reduced from £22,000 in 2016/17. As well as being used to fund events organised in response to external requests for civic hospitality, the decision was taken that those annual events organised by the Council such as the Holocaust event, Remembrance, and the Senior Citizens' Concerts, are to be funded from this budget. Examples of other things also funded from this budget are the costs of attendance at various charity events on approval of requests such as Fire Service Benevolent Fund Dinners; the costs associated with school debates; and the purchase of flowers for those known to be celebrating a special wedding anniversary or birthday (e.g. 100th birthday, diamond wedding anniversary etc.). As approved by the Council in June 2017, this year the costs associated with the Kirking of the new Council are also being met from the budget.

10. When the costs of these additional matters are taken into account, the amount of funding remaining in the 2017/18 budget to deal with new requests for civic hospitality is currently estimated to be £6,635.

11. In summary the estimated costs of approving the requests referred to in this report are as follows:-

12. If all of the requests are approved in full, the balance remaining in the budget is estimated to be \pounds 3,487.


