Renfrewshire Development Programme

4. The RDP is a service improvement and development programme involving the Royal Alexandra Hospital (RAH), 13 GP practices, community health and primary care services and social care services within Renfrewshire. It has developed and assessed new service models which aim to:
 - Improve the quality of healthcare including patient experience
 - Improve care at the interface between hospital and community care
 - Shorten length of stay
 - Reduce avoidable admissions to hospital
 - Maintain or improve rates of re-admission

Aids and Adaptations

7. A Resource Allocation Group was established on a temporary basis to implement a standardised response and develop robust criteria to manage referrals. The quality of referrals to Housing has improved.
8. The Lavern Valley OT Manager has redesigned how her team responds to requests for assistance. The new process has reduced the waiting list for OT assistance significantly. A key element of this redesign has been to alter the skill mix within the team with a visit being undertaken by OT assistant or rehab assistant, enabling Occupational Therapists to manage more complex requests. Aids and adaptations

requests are being responded to far more quickly. In recognition of this work it has been agreed that the model in Levern Valley should be implemented in the other cluster areas.

9. The HSCP Safe and Supported Steering Group is taking forward the plan with regular reporting to Unscheduled Care Programme Board

10. A meeting of the Strategic Planning Group took place on 30 October 2017.
