THE EAST RENFREWSHIRE COUNCIL (NETHERLEE & STAMPERLAND) (ON-STREET) (WAITING AND LOADING) ORDER 2016

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of the report is to recommend the Council approve the making and confirmation of "The East Renfrewshire Council (Netherlee & Stamperland) (On-Street) (Waiting and Loading) Order 2016".

RECOMMENDATIONS

2. It is recommended that the Council approve the making and confirmation of "The East Renfrewshire Council (Netherlee & Stamperland) (On-Street) (Waiting and Loading) Order 2016" and delegate to the Director of Environment the implementation of the Order in accordance with the associated statutory procedures.

BACKGROUND

3. The Council introduced Decriminalised Parking Enforcement (DPE) in April 2013 and became the Parking Authority for East Renfrewshire.

REPORT

- 4. A review of current restrictions was undertaken to assess the demands on the transport network taking into consideration changes to road layouts, increased volumes of vehicular and pedestrian traffic and associated road safety issues as a precursor to a formal consultation process and making of a new Order.
- 5. An informal consultation seeking feedback on suggested changes to the restrictions was carried out from 2 March 2015 to 23 March 2015. Due to the high volume of responses and a request from Elected Members the deadline was extended to 30 March 2015. Over 700 questionnaires were sent to frontagers directly affected by proposed changes and to properties within 50 metres of a proposed restriction. Exhibition boards showing the current and proposed restrictions along with paper questionnaires were put on public display in the Clarkston Community Library. Digital copies of the display boards and questionnaire were also made available on the Council's website. A total of 178 responses were subsequently received with 152 of those coming from residents, 16 from businesses, and 10 visitors. Most responses, 82% of total, were from residents with more than half of all responses coming from residents of the north end of Netherlee, from Williamwood Drive to the Council boundary at Muirend.
- 6. The main issues raised by respondents were the general lack of available parking in the area and the peak time restrictions on Clarkston Road.

- 7. There was support for eliminating and reducing the restrictions on weekend and peak time parking along Clarkston Road.
- 8. Following the informal consultation and the feedback received, a formal consultation was carried out from 23 June and 15 July 2016 in compliance with "The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) Scotland Regulations 1999 (and subsequent amendments)". After requests from Elected Members and residents, the deadline was extended to 5 August 2016. Police Scotland, emergency services and all other organisations/persons likely to be affected by any provision in the order were notified individually of the proposals. Notices of the proposals were also published in the local 'Eastwood Extra' newspaper.
- 9. The key proposals in the Draft Order are summarised in the table in Appendix 1. The list is not comprehensive and the full proposals are contained within the Draft Order. Copies of the existing and Draft Orders are available in the Members' Library and on the Council Website. The key proposals are:-
 - Limited waiting time of 60 minutes Monday to Friday on sections of Clarkston Road fronting shops
 - Revocation of the weekend, morning and evening peak hours restrictions on majority of Clarkston Road
 - Introduction of No Waiting at Any Time within 10 metres of numerous junctions and across shared access dropped kerbs
 - No specific On-Street Disabled Persons' Parking Bays proposed due to existing exemptions from waiting restrictions already available to Blue Badge holders.
- 10. A total of 24 letters or emails on the proposals were received, of which 12 were objections/representations, 3 were in support, and the remaining 9 general enquiries. Of the 12 objections/representations, none were from statutory consultees, 2 were from residents of Moray Drive, 1 objected to the lessening of restrictions along Clarkston Road, and the remaining 8 were from were from residents of or near Clarkston Road. All 24 correspondences receive an acknowledgment reply and the 12 correspondences of objection/representation were considered and each objector received a response from the Council outlining, where appropriate, any amendments that would be considered. The amendments have sought to address where feasible, the concerns brought forward by residents. However, none of the resultant amendments to the proposals made the Order more restrictive as this would have required the Council to re-advertise the Order.
- 11. Some of the objections requested more stringent restrictions. Any change from the advertised Order that would increase the severity of restrictions would require the entire Order to be re-advertised and re-consulted. In view of this these requests were not deemed appropriate at this time and were not applied. A summary of all objections and the response or proposed action to each is attached as Appendix 2.
- 12. In accordance with the statutory procedures, none of the objections require the Council to hold a Hearing by an Independent Reporter.

FINANCE AND EFFICIENCY

13. There will be a requirement to renew / refresh lining and signing, update the Parking Attendants' hand held computers and carry out publicity. There will also be the normal maintenance costs associated with occasional lining and signing replacement which is estimated to be in the region of £1500 every 8-10 years.

14. The financial implications of implementing the Traffic Regulation Order will be met from existing resources.

CONSULTATION

15. Consultation with regards to this order, undertaken between 23 June and 15 July 2016, extended to 5 August 2016, was carried out in compliance with "The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) Scotland Regulations 1999 (and subsequent amendments)". Police Scotland, emergency services and all other organisations/persons likely to be affected by any provision in the order were notified individually of the proposals. Notices of the proposals were also published in the local 'Eastwood Extra' newspaper.

PARTNERSHIP WORKING

16. The Council's parking enforcement is a joint working arrangement between Roads & Transportation Services and Corporate & Community Services. The Service departments have worked closely on the preparation of the draft Traffic Regulation Order to ensure that the new restrictions can be readily enforced and incorporated into the work programme.

IMPLICATIONS OF THE PROPOSALS

- 17. Introduction of new & amended on-street waiting and loading restrictions in Netherlee & Stamperland.
- 18. There will be no property, IT, equalities or sustainability implications arising from the proposals.

CONCLUSIONS

19. "The East Renfrewshire Council (Netherlee & Stamperland) (On-Street) (Waiting and Loading) Order 2016", introducing new on-street waiting and loading restrictions in Netherlee & Stamperland, will balance the demands on the transport network taking into consideration changes to road usage and volumes of vehicular and pedestrian traffic and associated road safety issues.

RECOMMENDATIONS

20. It is recommended that the Council approve the making and confirmation of "The East Renfrewshire Council (Netherlee & Stamperland) (On-Street) (Waiting and Loading) Order 2016" and delegate to the Director of Environment the implementation of the Order in accordance with the associated statutory procedures.
