Matter Arising - Community Led Support (CLS) Sub Groups

3. It was confirmed that an administrative error at the time of the move to the new Eastwood Health and Care Centre was the reason for short notice for sub groups. An apology was given at the Steering Group. The Steering Group have discussed communication and relaunch of the 6 workgroups to the wider community and other stakeholders.

Matter Arising - Bonnyton House

4. A paper with a recommendation of a preferred bidder will be discussed at the cabinet meeting on 13 October 2016.

We can confirm that neither of the bidders have any care homes in England or Wales

Matter Arising - Learning Disability Redesign

5. The financial framework for the learning disability long stay redesign will be finalised once assessments for all individuals are completed. It is anticipated that a full report will be available for the November meeting of the Integration Joint Board.

Strategic Services Planning- Acute Services

- 6. The Head of Strategic Service has notified NHSGGC of the views of the Integration Joint Board.
- 7. The Health and Social Care Partnership and Public Partnership Forum are currently linking with NHSGGC Patient Experience Public Involvement Team to facilitate local engagement regarding the NHSGGC Board's proposed transfer of paediatric emergency and elective inpatient and day case care from the Royal Alexandra Hospital in Paisley to the Royal Hospital for Children, with the

retention of outpatient services, the specialist Community Paediatric service (PANDA), and emergency care for those who self-refer at the Royal Alexandra Hospital.

Participation and Engagement Strategy

8. Arrangements for the implementation of the strategy are underway. Work is underway to develop the Health and Social Care Partnership website as part of this work the participation and engagement strategy will be publicised through information on the web.
