## REQUEST FOR CIVIC HOSPITALITY

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1. To consider a request to attend a fund raising event for Kilbryde Hospice.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

2. That the committee considers the request as outlined in the accompanying appendix.

#### **BACKGROUND**

3. On 26 June 2013, the Council agreed to establish a Civic Hospitality Committee with the following terms of reference:-

To be responsible for all civic hospitality matters on behalf of the Council including the:-

- consideration and determination of all requests for the provision of civic hospitality by the Council with an estimated cost of over £400;
- consideration and determination of any proposed new Council events to be funded from the civic hospitality budget; and
- consideration and approval of all protocols and procedures associated with civic hospitality.

## **REPORT**

4. A request for civic hospitality has been received from Kilbryde Hospice which, if approved, would cost more than £400. In view of this the request needs to be considered by the committee. The details of the request are included in the accompanying appendix.

## **BUDGET**

5. The 2014/15 budget for civic hospitality is £22,000. As well as being used to fund those events that are organised in response to external requests for civic hospitality, the decision was taken that those annual events organised by the Council such as the annual Holocaust event, Remembrance, and the Senior Citizens' Concerts, are to be funded from this budget. Examples of other things also funded from this budget are the costs of attendance at any charity events such as the Fire Service Benevolent Fund Dinner, the costs

associated with school debates, and the purchase of flowers for those known to be celebrating a special wedding anniversary or birthday (e.g. 100<sup>th</sup> birthday, diamond wedding anniversary etc.).

6. When the costs of these additional matters are taken into account, the amount of funding remaining in the 2014/15 budget to deal with new requests for civic hospitality is currently estimated to be £5,107.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

7. That the committee considers the request as outlined in the accompanying appendix.
