#### **1) Welcome & apologies.**

#### **3) Police report/update**

#### **4) Councillors updates/points**

- Greenhags work still being done before Viridor to take over mid August. Road to be dug up for phone lines, light put in etc. Still 25% down on staff, to provide normal bin collection. Paper recycling will go to Thornliebank in future.
- Grassland at the top of Bonnyton Drive, people possibly camping out, and mess left. Being investigated who's land this is, and if anything can be done.
- Grass cutting being done by different team, as Environment have been redeployed for rubbish collection.
- Land behind Craigbank Crescent and Alexander Avenue flats up for sale, 32 parking spaces/units development. Caroline meeting the resident/owner who contacted her and will report back.
- Council meetings might be back maybe September. All being done online for now. Meetings will be made available for public, to keep transparency.
- Application gone into Sustrans for a substantial amount.
- Update requested on the shops improvement.

#### **5) Picketlaw Reservoir**

Scottish waterboard to be contacted to add a fence. DW will action this.

Similar thing happening at Braidbar Quarry, and other places. Will wait for feedback from the Police on this matter. CB suggested Police & Fire could mention the dangers during their talks with S1 & S2 pupils.

Have asked for a bin to be added as close to the reservoir as is possible for the council to pick up.

## **6) War Memorial refurbishment update**

AOE application for £2.5K from the History Society. Church happy for that to be done, as they are trying to save money for the roof.

## **7) CC Members updates/points.**

Duncan – Wooded area at golf course with Forestry Commission. Fences were put up to protect, gate was locked during pandemic, but remains locked due to misuse. Damage done to trees. Duncan to mail Golf club.

Ailsa - Field onto Holehouse road used as a shortcut to the park. Crop now put and access blocked. Right to roam breached?

Niall – Glasgow road island put in to reduce car speed. More dangerous to cyclists?

Christine – Shop canopy has been repaired at the top end. Shop owners responsibility, council will monitor and survey, but not step in.
