	2. ERC could re-locate the statute elsewhere.	
	<ol> <li>Hand over the statute to the Mearnskirk Owners Association who could then set up a trust and purchase a piece of land. There is some common ground still owned by the builders.</li> </ol>	
	The preferred outcome would be if Dundas would sign over a tiny piece of the land in the tree lined avenue entrance to Mearnskirk. This would make an ideal location for this statue.
